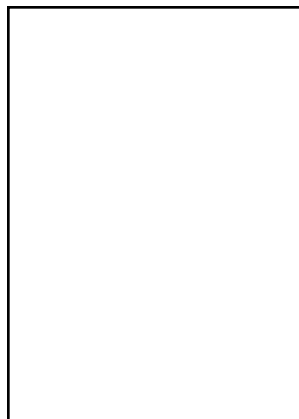

WORSHIP

Sunday Worship Services - This summer we continue our focus on the gospel of Luke. What makes this gospel account unique and why did Luke write it? And, most importantly, how does it relate to our lives today?

Sunday, August 15 will be a special Sunday as we join the Church throughout the world in remembering and giving thanks to the God for Mary, the mother of our Lord.

Looking ahead, we continue our planning for an exciting and meaningful year (Sept 2010 – June 2011) of worship. Some highlights include a focus on Prayer in October, the Sermon on the Mount in February, the petitions of the Lord's Prayer in Lent, and a look at 1 Peter in May. Throughout the year, there will be a special focus on LOVE.

Worship Survey Results

In July a short, 10 question online worship service was sent out via email. Here are the results:

- In general, how much do you like the bulletin (size, format, inclusion of all worship information, explanatory comments)?
I like! = 60.3% (44) No opinion. = 12.3% (9) I don't. = 27.4% (20)
- In general, how do you like the placement of the baptismal font at the entrance of the church (symbolizing one's entrance into the Body of Christ)?
I like! = 42.7% (32) No opinion. = 30.7% (23) I don't. = 26.7% (20)
- How did you like the opportunity to be prayed for individually after worship on Pentecost (May 23)?
I liked! = 48.7% (38) No opinion. = 43.6% (34) I didn't. = 7.7% (6)
- In general, how much do you like receiving "Weekend Highlights" each week via e-mail?
I like! = 93.5% (72) No opinion. = 6.5% (5) I don't. = 0% (0)
- Have we sung your favorite hymn in the last few months?
Yes. = 48% (36) I don't have one. = 28% (21) No. = 24% (18)
- Would you be willing to serve on a team that helps prepare and improve WORSHIP at Emmanuel (meeting 4-6 times a year)?
Yes. = 25% (18) Maybe. = 33.3% (24) No. = 41.7% (30)

Monthly Worship Highlight – USHERS

The first person each member or visitor sees upon entering church each Sunday is the usher. If you stick around long enough, you'll also notice that they are some of the last ones to leave. From providing the welcoming "first-impression" greeting to all who come, to making sure that everyone has what they need to worship (bulletin, a seat, directions to the restroom or nursery J), to receiving the offerings and presenting them at the altar, to directing the flow of people to communion, to cleaning up after people leave – and basically filling every other, often unexpected, need, the ushers are always here to serve. 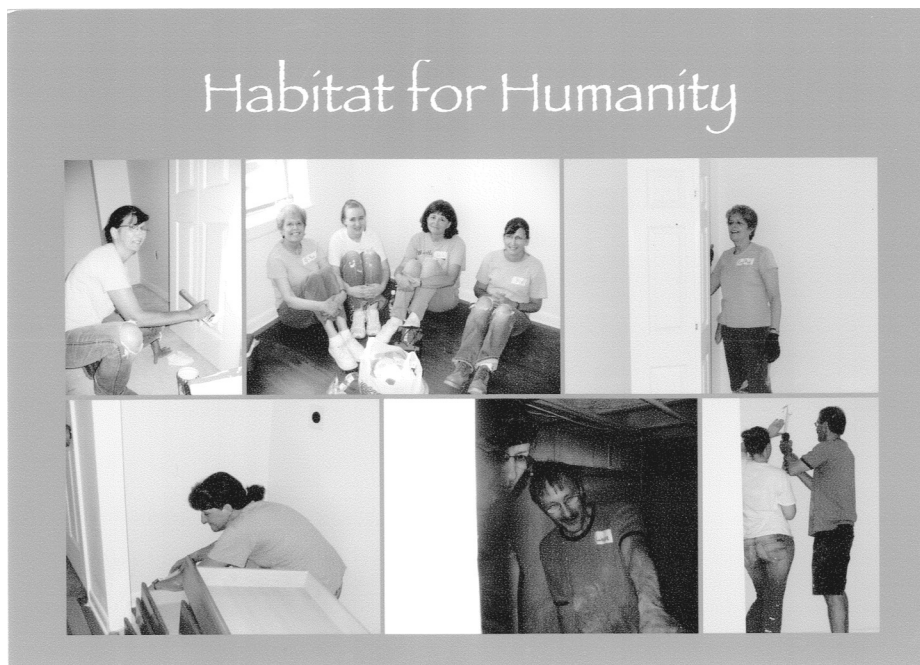

More and more people from Emmanuel are finding faithful and fruitful ways to WITNESS their faith, both individually or with their Fellowship Group or with other groups of people. Too numerous to list all of the WITNESS efforts, read below to get a picture of some of the things going on and see how you might join in.

Helping the Homeless and those in need

We continue to work closely with the Lazarus Caucus in their work at the Westside Homeless Shelter on the campus of Spring Grove Hospital. Twice a month we provide meals for the men (sign up on the sheet at the Welcome Table). One of our Fellowship Groups has taken up the task of providing "Move-In Kits" to help the men as they transition to normal housing. Once a month Emmanuel volunteers go to the shelter to wash the feet of normally over 30 men, providing them with new socks. We now also have on site the clothes closet for Lazarus which provides free clothing for the men. And then we continue to stock, with your donations, a small food pantry that gets used regularly by many people each week in need of a little extra help.

100,000 Loaves of Bread – Caravan of Compassion

On Thursday, July 1st, we did our part in working with Lutheran Mission Society to give out 100,000 loaves of bread throughout Maryland during the month of July. Emmanuel volunteers took bread from the tractor-trailer and gave it out to those who showed up and then went even further by handing it out to those driving by, waiting at the bus stop, and even at a local business. Overall it was a great day to be able to give some bread away in the name of Him who is the Bread of Life.

A Lazarus "Move-in" Kit for Gus

A small Bible study group from Emmanuel Lutheran Church was looking for an outreach project and started collecting items to create "move-in kits" for the men moving from the Westside Shelter to apartments. At the beginning of June, between this group, their neighbors, their friends, and their co-workers, they were able to provide Gus with just about everything he needed to set up house! The outpouring of generosity was incredible and our wonderful shoppers got some great deals at local thrift stores, an estate sale, and some neighbor's basements to provide furniture, small kitchen appliances, cookware, and dishes, as well as cleaning supplies for Gus. The four volunteers that moved him in could tell he was looking forward to making his own coffee- in his own kitchen- in his own coffee pot!

Michael Johnson for the sake of building up the Kingdom of God in Baltimore through church planting and congregational revitalization, under the auspices of Lutheran Mission Society.

FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS FOR

Financial Report for Fiscal Year 2010

Offering collections were up 9% over the budgeted amount, despite a slight decrease in weekly attendance.

Tuition receipts were \$186,000 below the budgeted amount due to less than anticipated enrollment.

Expenses were \$58,000 under budget.

The final deficit for the year was \$126,320 which was funded by drawing down the restricted funds.

Emmanuel's Organs New Bells - Recently a question was asked about our zimbelstern which was added to Emmanuel's organ about four years ago. The zimbelstern, which is German for "bell star", is a rotating star with bells fixed to its points which spin around while being struck by a clapper. This produces a delicate tinkling sound. They were quite common on organs built between 1550 and 1750 and can also be seen on many of today's organs. However, ours is similar to the one in the picture, which is made up of eight small stationary bells that are arranged in a circle. It is played in a random fashion as a clapper spins around in the center and strikes the bellsIt can use sound in various ways to represent an idea in a musical or worship experience. At Emmanuel it can be heard in the communion liturgy prior to and during the singing of the Sanctus. The pastor says, "... and so with the Church on earth *and the hosts of heaven* we praise Your name and join in their unending hymn:" The playing of the zimbelstern at that point is a musical representation of the choirs of heaven joining us as we sing the Sanctus. It can also be used during the singing of a hymn stanza that addresses the Trinity or a stanza that depicts the idea of light or angels. Finally, organ repertoire that is delicate and transparent lends itself to its use.
