Financial Update

As of April, the current expense deficit is \$19,345 (an improvement over last year's deficit of \$90,230). In April, offering receipts are slightly ahead of last year, though overall about \$20,000 below the amount budgeted. Tuition receipts are still below expectations. Expenses, in total, are slightly above budgeted amounts. Expected full year deficit is in the range of \$30-50k. What can you do?
